RULES

1. All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor.
2. Exhibits to be staged between 9.30 am and 11.30 am on the morning of the show. The hall to be cleared of all persons except officials by no later than 11.30 am. Doors reopen 1.30 pm approx.
3. Entry fee is 20p per entry except for children who may enter Class 9 – Children's Section, free of charge.
4. Exhibitors must not interfere in any way with exhibits already staged by other exhibitors.
5. Any exhibit needing to be moved may only be done so by its exhibitor or by a member of the Show Committee.
6. Prizes are awarded on a points system and the following point values will apply – 1st five points, 2nd two points and 3rd one point.
7. The decision of the Judges is absolutely final. No appeal procedure is available.
8. No exhibit shall be removed before 3.30 pm. Exhibits not for sale must be removed by no later than 4.00 pm. Exhibits remaining thereafter are deemed to be donations to the Association and may be sold or donated to charity.
9. Trophy Winners will be announced and presented at the end of the Show. Prizes awarded at 3.30 pm.
10. Exhibits in the Handicraft Section must not have been exhibited in any previous show of the Association.
11. All Cups held by a winning exhibitor must be returned to the Association no less than one month prior to the next show or in the absence of a show upon demand by the Secretary of the Association. At all times the cups remain the property of the Association.
12. Certificates are held outright.
13. All rules taken from the Horticultural Show Handbook.
14. Limited show vases available from the hall on the day. So if you can please bring your own.

Clarity of Tray of Vegetables Regulations

Points for the Tray of Vegetables exhibits vary.

You could be awarded between 10 to 20 points per vegetable, depending on the vegetables size, condition and uniformity of display. Tray size should be approximately 18" x 24". A Black seed tray is ideal.

Example:

- Carrots pointed and long, not overhanging the tray edges – up to 20pts.
- Beans dwarf – up to 15pts
- Parsnips – up to 20pts

SHOW SCHEDULE 2018

SECTION ONE - DAHLIA

1. One bloom of large or giant Dahlia any variety
(over 260mm in diameter)
2. One vase of 3 blooms large or giant Dahlia one variety
(Between 220mm and 260mm for medium, over 260mm for giant in diameter)
3. One vase 3 blooms medium Dahlia, one variety
(Between 170mm and 220mm in diameter)
4. One vase 3 blooms small Dahlia, one variety
(Between 115mm and 170mm in diameter)
5. One vase 3 blooms small Cactus Dahlia, one variety
(Between 115mm and 170mm in diameter)
6. One vase 3 blooms Pom Pom Dahlia, one variety
(Between 115mm and 170mm in diameter)

Sizes are guides only.

SECTION TWO – CHRYSANTHEMUMS

7. One vase 3 incurved blooms large, medium or small Chrysanthemums
8. One vase 3 reflexed blooms large, medium or small Chrysanthemums
9. One vase 3 stems sprays large, large, medium or small Chrysanthemums
10. One vase, one Bloom any variety large, medium or small Chrysanthemums

SECTION THREE – FLORAL

11. One vase of 3 Gladioli spikes any cultivar
12. Button hole
13. One vase or one Rose any cultivar
14. One vase of cut flowers no more than 9 stems from a minimum of 3 different types of plants
15. One vase of sweet peas mixed 6 stems
16. One pot grown plant flowering or foliage

SECTION FOUR – DOMESTIC (classes 17 to 19 should be labelled)

17. Jar of Chutney any variety (jars should be as near to 1lb jars as possible)
18. Jar of Jam, fresh fruit not jelly (presented with wax disc and covered)
19. Jar of Honey
20. Jar of Pickled Onions
21. Victoria Sponge
22. Four Cheese Scones
23. Home-made Bread of your choice (bread to be exhibited only)

SECTION FIVE – VEGETABLES

24. Five Runner Beans
25. Five French Beans
26. Three Beetroots with 3 inch tops, one cultivar
27. Three Parsnips, one cultivar (foliage trimmed for neatness – 3" tops)
28. Three Carrots, foliage trimmed to 4 inches
29. Three Onions, dressed, one cultivar*
30. Five Shallots, dressed, one cultivar*
31. One Cabbage with roots
32. Five Potatoes, White, one cultivar^
33. Five Potatoes, Coloured, one cultivar^
34. Five medium Tomatoes, ripe with calyces^
35. Eight cherry Tomatoes with calyces^
36. Three Leeks with roots and foliage trimmed for neatness, one cultivar
37. Two Marrows
38. Three Courgettes not more than 7 inches long
39. Two Cucumbers outdoor or indoor
40. One Pumpkin
41. Two sweetcorn, one cultivar^
42. One squash
43. Usual vegetable not listed in any other category
44. One tray of five kinds of Vegetables not less than two of each kind
(see clarity in rules section) – Tray size approx. 18" x 24". A seed tray is ideal.

**Dressed = on a plate, flower pot base, held upright by either sand or on base rings, tops must be tied.*

^ indicates to be placed on a white paper plate

SECTION SIX – FRUIT

45. One dish three dessert Apples, one cultivar
46. One dish three cooking Apples, one cultivar
47. One dish three Pears , one cultivar
48. One dish, any other fruit, one cultivar, minimum six berry, stone or pip

SECTION SEVEN – FLORAL ART

- 49. An exhibit from your garden or allotment of flowers and foliage of your choice.
- 50. In a basket a flower arrangement maximum 18in by 18in by 18in high (Arrangement area will be available on the day, all exhibits in this category must be home grown).

SECTION EIGHT – HANDICRAFT

- 51. Painting or Drawing of your choice
 - 52. Handicraft of your choice
 - 53. Photograph maximum size 7 x 5 inches (unmounted) Garden/Allotment Landscape A5 size or Wildlife on the Allotment /Garden A5 size
- NO previous entries can be exhibited.

SECTION NINE - CHILDREN'S SECTION (under 6, 7-10, 11-16)

- 54. Decorate an egg
 - 55. Vegetable art of your choice
 - 56. A craft of your choice i.e. Art, Knitting, Photography. Hammer Beads, Lego
 - 57. Mini allotment on a tray
 - 58. Make a cup cake or fairy cake and decorate as you wish
- (Please place your child's entry in the relevant age section at the table rather than category)*
