

Hertfordshire united against coronavirus: Volunteering

We have, as the county council, been asked to lead on communicating information and updates around volunteering to all partners across the county. **#TeamHerts Volunteering** will be coordinating Hertfordshire's official volunteer network for those affected by coronavirus, with support from Hertfordshire Care Providers Association (HCPA) and **HertsHelp**. **#TeamHerts** Volunteering will be matching location, availability and skills of the volunteer network to ensure we have the right support to allocate across the most vital of services. We also want to make sure that residents who are older, less able or self-isolating know where and how to get support should they need it.

Residents who are self-isolating and in need of support from volunteers, will be advised to contact **HertsHelp on 0300 123 4044**. Anyone currently using a social care service should expect that to continue, however they can speak to their care provider first or call on **0300 123 4042** for other urgent care needs. There are already lots of local successful schemes running in our communities, our aim is not to stop these, however we will be offering advice and support on staying and keeping safe. Sadly, there have been many reports of scams and opportunists operating in the name of goodwill around coronavirus – for this reason we will be asking existing genuine local and community groups to make **#TeamHerts** aware of their arrangements so that we can share an approved list on the Police, Neighbourhood Watch, **#TeamHerts Volunteering** and **HCC** channels for those who are vulnerable. The campaign hopes to inspire people to look out for others in their community, motivate residents who can to volunteer their time to help and support those who may be in need and/or feeling isolated. We want to focus on sharing messages of reassurance, reminding people to use trusted sources for information and advice and encouraging a humanitarian response to the virus.

As many of you will be aware, work has begun behind the scenes to coordinate our approach to volunteering. We will be working in partnership with local, district, town and parish councils and with colleagues across health, social and the voluntary sector to ensure the right support is in place for all residents. Thank you to those organisations who have supported this work so far, we appreciate this had to be done quickly; for those reading about this for the first time we look forward to working with you on this project moving forward.
