As the autumn term begins Officers continue their 'Safe for Schools' campaign targeting speeding, mobile phone usage and dangerous parking around the local schools.

Catalytic Converter thefts are on the increase, due to the value of scrap metal, particularly on diesel vehicles. In recent months the whole county has seen a rise in this kind of crime and East Herts has been one of the areas most affected. Sawbridgeworth Neighbourhood Police Team are able to mark vehicles with a unique identification number, which will help Police trace the CATs if they are stolen and identify those handling the stolen goods. Since the re-launch we have averaged around 900 visitors to the market each month which serves both local people and brings a lot of new faces into the town to take advantage of the retail offerings in our main shopping streets.
