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#### TOWN ACTION PLAN 2020-2024

### VISION

To ensure that the town is a welcoming, friendly and safe place to live, for residents of all ages, with a positive community spirit and a flourishing retail/business centre.

## GENERAL

This Plan includes ongoing Council priorities and suggestions made by residents in a survey conducted in December 2019 and on a Consultation day on 11 January 2020. It was presented to the Economic Development and Sawbridgeworth Town Action Plan Committee on 9 March 2020 and approved for presentation to the Annual Town Meeting. A summary of the consultation responses is included here as an appendix. Sawbridgeworth Town Council will continue to liaise with East Herts District Council and Hertfordshire County Council on issues which affect residents, but which are outside our direct control: roads, drains/gulleys, schools, planning/housing, footpaths and open spaces, etc. Similarly, we will continue to work with our PCSOs and constable to ensure that the town is a safe place to live through, inter alia, the Priority Setting Forum. We will continue to respond to consultations which affect the town and post our responses on the Council website. The Plan has been regularly updated during the Covid-19 outbreak **and presented at Sawbridgeworth Town Action Plan and Economic Development Committee meetings.** 

#### **ANNUAL REVIEW**

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This plan will be **regularly reviewed and updated for** the Council's Town Action Plan and Economic Development Committee **meetings** and an **updated Plan will be** presented at the Town Annual Meeting each April and **placed** on the Council website, **and shared** through other communication channels.

1 NEW HOUSING	
Where are we now?	Both developments in West Road (SAWB3 Barratt; 200 houses and SAWB2 Taylor Wimpey, 140 houses) <u>have started; SAWB4</u> partially approved 090920 (Countryside, 85 houses in Phase 1 plus outline approval for 99 houses in Phase 2 at Kecksys); S106 funding agreed for SAWB2 (March 2020) and 3 (January 2020), pending for SAWB4. <u>Street names for SAWB2 agreed with EHDC/developer; SAWB3 names taken from War</u> <u>memorial (no STC involvement). SAWB4 Phase 1</u> <u>names sent to EHDC/developer; SAWB4 106</u> <u>allocations still to be confirmed.</u>
Where do we want to be by 2024?	Sustainable developments approved and built; S106 money allocated satisfactorily; street names agreed; welcome pack developed and distributed.
<ul> <li>Monitor developments: County Cllr Eric Buckmaster has set up meetings with both West Road developers to address planning breaches, construction-related issues and residents' concerns; regular meetings involving STC representatives and residents' representatives planned and communications channel set up to report issues.</li> <li>Liaise with East Herts District Council (EHDC) and developers to ensure new housing meets local needs and is energy-efficient and sustainable.</li> <li>Ensure that the Council is fully consulted on Section106 funding from developers to improve town amenities and infrastructure.</li> <li>Coordinate suggestions for <u>SAWB4 street names</u>, for forwarding to EDC, in liaison with local community groups.</li> </ul>	

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• Investigate funding for and facilitate the development of a 'welcome pack' of information for new residents in consultation with developers, estate agents, community groups and churches, and the library.	
ACTION AREA	PROGRESS TO DATE
2 TRAFFIC	
Where are we now?	Regular traffic jams at peak times; M11 diversions; M11 Junction 7a will be operational by 2022. Presentation by Arup in September 2019 to improve central part of town. Social distancing requirements and possible changes to Bell Street layout discussed with HCC and EHDC. Consultation carried out on 20mph limit in SE quadrant. <u>STC</u> response sent on <u>HCC Eastern Area Growth and Transport Plan</u> .
Where do we want to be by 2024?	Reconfiguration of West/Station Road junction; improvements to town centre planned and funded including 20mph zones; one-way system in Sheering Mill Lane; safer/rescheduled delivery vehicle parking on Bell Street; cycling/walking improvements initiated.

<ul> <li>Work with Hertfordshire County Council (HCC) and EHDC and County Councillor to ensure that the proposed reconfiguration of the West Road/Station Road junction adequately mitigates the impact of increased traffic.</li> <li>Liaise with HCC and County Councillor to improve traffic flow in the centre of town; to investigate 20mph speed limit areas and improvements to the Bell Street/London Road, Bell Street/Town Square/Knight Street and Knight Street/Station Road junctions (Section 106?). Implement some of suggestions made by Arup in September 2019 as part of Station Road/West Road junction improvement planning.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Work with EHDC/HCC and other parties to improve cycling infrastructure both within the town and to/from the town including new developments and tow path.</li> </ul>
